About CSUB

California State University, Bakersfield, is a comprehensive public University committed to offering excellent undergraduate and graduate programs that advance the intellectual and personal development of its students. An emphasis on student learning is enhanced by a commitment to scholarship, diversity, service, global awareness and life-long learning. The University collaborates with partners in the community to increase the region's overall educational attainment, enhance its quality of life, and support its economic development. The University was founded in 1965 and opened for classes in fall, 1970. The University's faculty is world-class, with nearly 75% holding the highest degrees in their respective fields. A part of the 23-campus California State University (CSU) System, CSUB has a student body that reflects the diversity of the southern San Joaquin Valley, with approximately 55% of the student body of Hispanic origin. CSUB's vision is to be the leading campus in the CSU system in terms of faculty and academic excellence and diversity, quality of the student experience and community engagement.

The University serves more than 9,500 students at either the main campus in Bakersfield or the Antelope Valley Center and counts approximately 47,000 alumni from its four schools: Arts and Humanities; Business and Public Administration; Natural Sciences, Mathematics and Engineering; and Social Sciences and Education. The University offers undergraduate, graduate, and post-graduate and credential programs, and CSUB's Extended University serves the community by offering additional professional development, certificate, and degree programs. The School of Arts and Humanities is dedicated to connecting the arts and humanities to everyday life. Required Qualifications:

- A terminal degree in one of the School's disciplines
- Evidence of significant scholarly and professional achievement sufficient to merit a tenured faculty appointment at the rank of professor in one of the School's departments
- Evidence of successful teaching experience in one of the disciplines represented in the School
- Demonstrated success in academic administration and leadership at the school (Department Chair or above) and/or university level
- Proven record of commitment to diversity and to a student culture of non-traditional and first-generation college students
- Demonstrated success in working with important constituencies to build relationships and develop funding, public and private
- Experience with fiscal management procedures and personnel management
- Evidence of successful fundraising and external partnerships development

Preferred Qualifications:

- A record of effectiveness in developing and implementing strategic plans
- Evidence of advocating equitably across disparate departments or programs
- Evidence of a commitment to collegiality, both within the applicant's school and across the applicant's campus
- Evidence of successful teaching experience at the undergraduate and graduate levels
- Evidence of building successful community partnerships/relationships
- An ability to work effectively with other university administrators
- Experience building or supporting satellite campus programs
- Experience with accreditation processes will be a plus
